They will go over the material, and then practice their presentation using the powerpoint programs for each. Their

presentations will include adult supervision.

Service projects and outings will also be planned. In February, they will be learning about our shut-ins and be making cards or sending notes to them around Valentine’s Day!

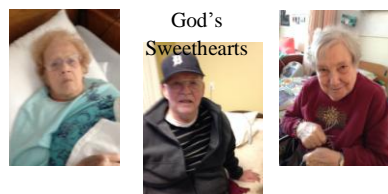
Led by teens with adult supervision, the children will have an action packed time and be challenged as they see opportunities that lie ahead for them!
