Hosea—“Salvation”

Gomer-- “complete”

Jezreel— “God will sow”

Lo-Ruhamah—“not loved”

Lo-Ammi— “not my people”

Hosea 1:2-5 Known to be an immoral woman (from an immoral family—given to sensuality) and yet married a man of God. She is used as an illustration to God’s people of how God views them. Her child was used of God to send a message to God’s people.

Hosea 1:6-8 She bears a daughter who also is used of God to send a message to God’s people.

Hosea 1:9 – 2:1 Her second son, is also used of God to send a message.

Hosea 3:1-3 Her infidelity led her back into slavery. Hosea’s redemption of her, is used as an illustration of God’s love and grace.
