## Bible Overview Lesson 2

We find the origins of all things (except God and Jesus), in the book of Genesis (Hebrew for Beginning). In Genesis: man is formed, man sins, man is destroyed by the flood (Except Noah and his family). God then forms a covenant with Abraham and his descendants to be His people. The remainder of the Old Testament deals with God's working with these people, the Hebrews.

God delivers the Hebrews (Jews) from slavery in Egypt and leads them into the Promised Land. Judges rule over them and deliver them from their enemies.

Israel is not content with Judges, and they ask for a king. God relants and Saul, David and Solomon reign. Following Solomon, the kingdom is split in two: Israel in the North (10 tribes) and Judah in the South (2 tribes). Each kingdom turns to idolatry and is destroyed by God (Israel by Assyria in 722 BC and Judah by Babylon in 587 BC).

God allows Judah to return and rebuild Jerusalem and their country, when He punishes Babylon.

There is a silent period of 400 years which takes place between the time of the Old Testament and the New Testament.

Jesus, the Son of God, enters the world and lives as a testimony of how man is to live; and dies as a sacrifice for the sins of man. On the 3<sup>rd</sup> day He is raised to life, overcoming death and appears on earth for 40 days. Then He ascends to heaven, leaving His disciples behind to wait for the coming of the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit comes on the day of Pentecost and the church is started as 3,000 are immersed on that day. The church then spreads from Jerusalem to Jdea, to Samaria and then to the uttermost parts of the world.

God tells His people to remain faithful before the cataclysmic ending of the world.
