BACKGROUND:

Romans: Written to the believers in Rome. Deals with the Gospel and how it affects our daily lives.

<u>Galatians</u>: Written to the churches in "Galatia". The Apostle had helped start these congregations and was frustrated that they had deviated from the Gospel.

Ephesians: Paul had a "lengthy" ministry among them and had seen the impact of their lives upon the community. Message strives to build unity in the body and focus on how living for God should affect our relationships.

Philippians: Paul had been imprisoned in this city and was found praying and praising at midnight. He reminds the believers not to be discouraged but to keep their eyes focused on Jesus and the future that our Lord has for them.

<u>Colossians</u>: Paul had started churches in the area and reminds them of the supremacy of Christ and how their lives should reflect Jesus' Lordship.

Philemon: Paul becomes familiar with a runaway slave and returns him to the owner with admonition and encouragement on treating them as a brother in Christ.
