

Buddy Mason continues recovery

"On October 12th and again on November 1st, Lowell underwent 2 extensive spingal surgeries. The surgeons were treating him for severe spinal stenosis.

Over the past few years, he had been slowly losing feeling and mobility in his arms and legs. Due to his dwarfism, there are only a handful of surgeons trained to do these intense and risky opersations. After months of mis-diagnosis, he was finally able to find help. Following the surgery, he spent 3 weeks in the hospital, and then almos 3 months in a rehabilitation facility.

Finally, he returned home just a few days ago. The doctor has ordered home therapy to continue because his mobility and feeling are still very limited.

Since the age of 9, Lowell has traveled the country and the world singing Gospel music. And up until 1 week before his surgery, he was still on the raod singing. The carrier on the back of his vehicle of his motorized scooter. However, his wife had to basically lift him into the vehicle!

Since the surgeries, Lowell and his wife have not been able to travel and sing, resulting in no income for over 4 months!

Lowell has spent over 70 years traveling and spreading the message of Christ, across America and Around the World! And during Lowell and Judy's 54 years of marriage, their ministry has been focuse on helping people in times of need. From world-wide issions, to disaster relief at home and abroad they have been dedicated to spreading God's love by helping others. Lowell wants to return to traveling and spreading the Gospel!

When Buddy was facing his surgery, the doctors warned that it could leave him paralyzed or affect his voice. God brought him through without any of those complications.

Recently, one our ladies was admitted to the hospital for the "flu." Doctors discovered that her heart is only operating at 30%. They found no blockages and she is to meet with a heart doctor to find out what the plan is. She is now home serving her family and Lord while waiting for her appointment.

Another of our ladies recently spent a weekend in the hospital, with her daughter concerned about a stroke. She too is home, and is scheduled to meet with the Dr. soon for results.

Tracy continues to recover (now at home) following a brain aneurism.

Other members have also faced health concerns or continual struggles. God enables them to continue on each day and remain faithful in attendance and service.

Last month we added Deb's grand nephew who was heading to a mission field, where the leader had been arrested for preaching the Gospel. God not only provided safety, but enabled her great nephew to share his testimony with fellow athletes in the country AND the leader was released from prison within 1 week of our starting to pray about the matter!

Study in the Major Prophets!

Our study in Isaiah has made it clear that God was reaching out not only to the Jews in the Old Testament, but also to surrounding nations. Messages of warning and judgement were sent to all of the known world. God's power is further revealed as He laid out world history for nearly 300 years (not including the prophecies of Jesus' coming). He specified, which nation would rise and then who would replace them. At one point, He even mentions by NAME a future leader!

God's people are reassured that GOD can protect and deliver them. Instead, they would rely on alliances and armies that would prove to be failures. Times when they DID trust, God delivered.

It's also fascinating to see the offenses that God identifies. Oppression, injustice, lack of compassion, rejoicing over enemies are mentioned, besides idolatry.
