Passover Part 1

- Exodus 12:1-5 Take male, year old perfect lamb on 10<sup>th</sup> day of first month. One per family (unless too much for one family then share)
- Exodus 12:6-11, 46 To be killed on 14<sup>th</sup> day of month at twilight and blood on door frames. Eat the lamb (roasted by fire) that evening . All of the meat to be consumed. Eaten in haste, with staff in hand. NO BONES TO BE BROKEN.
- Exodus 12:12-13 Lord will strike firstborn in any house without the blood as a sign.
- Exodus 12:14 Commemorate as lasting ordinance
- Leviticus 23:4, 5 Begins at twilight on 14<sup>th</sup> day.
- Numbers 9:1-5 Passover celebrated for the second time the following year in wilderness.

Numbers 9:6-14 Provisions made for those that are absent or unclean.

Joshua 5:10-12 Passover observed in Promised land

2 Kings 23:21-23 King Josiah has Passover observed after many years without it being observed.

2 Chronicles 35:1-19 Another account of King Josiah's Passover observation.

Lighting of candles & Blessing:

4 cups of the Fruit of the Vine:

- 1. Cup of Sanctification-- I will bring you out
- 2. Cup of Plagues (Deliverance)—Deliver you from Bondage
- 3. Cup of Redemption—Redeem you with outstretched arm
- 4. Cup of Praise—I will take you for My people

1<sup>ST</sup> CUP:

Hand washing

Bitter Herbs--Parsley; Green-life; salt water—tears

Removal of "Afikomen)—3 wrapped slices of matzah and middle is taken (Abraham, Isaac, Jacob; Isaac taken out to be sacrificed). Middle piece is taken out, broken in half; taken out ; half warpped in white linen and hidden (to be found later during the  $3^{rd}$  cup)

2<sup>nd</sup> CUP:

Another piece of Matzah-bread of affliction-Pierced and striped

Bitter Herbs—horseradish—Matzah dipped into and enough taken to bring tear to the eye.

Sweetness—apples & spices—symbolizes mortar and labor used to make bricks and sweetness of labor

Egg—Temple and holy day sacrifices' Life eternal

Four Questions:

- 1. Why Matzah?
- 2. Why Bitter herbs?
- 3. Why dip twice?
- 4. Why recline?

Lamb-- sacrifice, whose blood spared those that put on door frame

Finding and Reward for Afikomen-piece broken and shared with everyone

3<sup>rd</sup> CUP

Look at deep red and remember the blood that was shePassoverd

4<sup>th</sup> Cup "Elijah's Cup"

Praise God as remember; Elijah expected to arrive and proclaim the coming One
