150th Anniversary September 9 & 11, 2016


Your family, friends, past members, and lovers of history will want to attend the special programs that have been planned!

Friday Night kicks things off at 7:00 with a 15 minute powerpoint presentation of: "What God has done the past 150 years at Pine Run". This chronicles events in our nation, community, congregation and their impact on the individuals involved at Pine Run. Appreciation and insight of what the people have gone through will be gained.

Friday at 7:30 will feature a concert by Lowell "Buddy" Mason.



Lowell came to Pine Run in 1942 when his father was hired as the minister. He went to the local schools, graduating from Clio High School in 1955. His gospel singing ministry began in 1946 (at the age of 9).





Light refreshments conclude the evening.

Sunday Morning (10:30 AM) will focus on the first 75 years of the church's ministry. Songs of praise will be sung, that were used by the congregation in the 1930's Sunday School. Lowell Mason will bring specials in song and the morning message will focus on the lessons learned those first 75 years.

A Carry In dinner will be enjoyed following the morning service. Meat, beverage and table service will be provided. People are encouraged to bring passing dishes and/or desserts to share.

The weekend will wrap up Sunday Night at 6:00 pm. Songs will be sung that were used at the 125th Celebration. Lowell Mason will share specials in music again. Lessons from the past 75 years to prepare us for the future will be shared.



Special offerings will be taken

throughout the weekend to help victims of <u>flooding in Louisiana</u>. Lowell Mason's, "We Care" ministry can help supply the resources, to truck the supplies in will cost \$5500 per truck load. The more we raise, the more help can be provided.


